We believe difficult childhood experiences can be painful, yet learning to cope effectively with those setbacks can lead to positive changes with lasting results. We understand that each youth's unique strengths, experiences and cultural perspectives help their ability to succeed in school and in life. With these strengths in mind, we assist youth and their families through tough issues.

Through our services, families have been reunited and tens of thousands of lives have been improved.

Our programs vary in intensity and length of service. Programs are reviewed by our internal program evaluation department, which has been documenting the results of our work and guiding program innovations and improvements for more than 30 years.

Our SAGE Youth Residential program provides long-term stabilization for survivors of commercial sexual exploitation (CSEC). Both during their exploitation and prior to it, many of these youth have experienced multiple environmental, social, and biological traumas including abuse, alcohol/ drug dependency, and high levels of emotional vulnerability.

SAGE serves vulnerable youth in the CSEC population by providing a safe and secure setting in which they can experience Support, Achieve their goals, **G**row, and become Empowered.

The program places the focus on providing a nurturing, safe, traumainformed milieu that will allow treatment to happen when the youth are ready.

Community Based Services

Morrison's community and school-based programs provide therapeutic support to children and families in their homes, schools, and communities.

By offering intensive therapy, increased case management, and support within community-based settings (where youth might not traditionally have access to services), we can meet the needs of a broad range of clients. This increases awareness and community support of mental health. In addition, youth and families with more intensive mental health needs receive specialized services within their homes and communities.

Our community and school-based outpatient programs include Crisis Prevention Outreach, Family Intensive Support Services, Home Intensive Outpatient Services, and Early Childhood Intensive Outpatient Services.
