



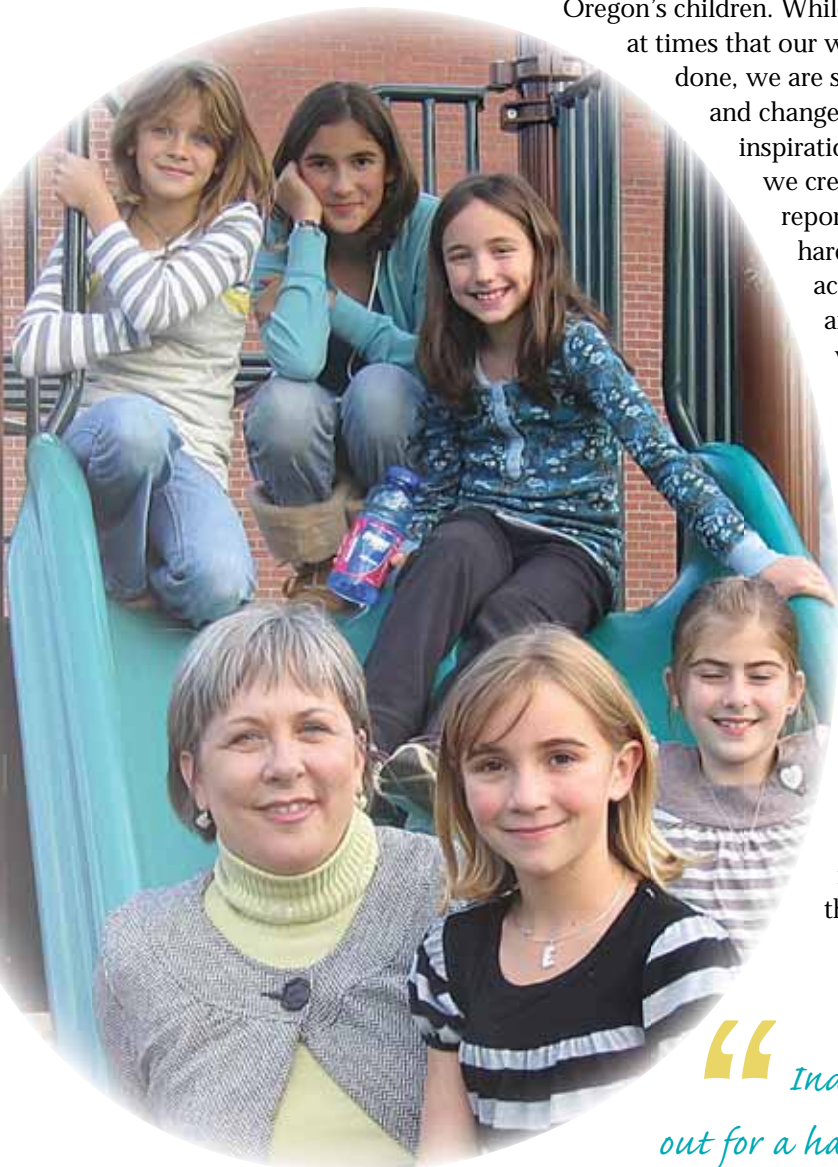

CEO's Report

Dear Friends,

I am excited to share with you some of our successes this year in evolving the organization and shaping the future of Oregon's children. While it may seem at times that our work is never done, we are seeing results and change that give me inspiration and hope. As we created this annual report, we worked hard to give you accurate facts and figures but what we most want you to understand is that beyond the numbers is the human impact of every dollar spent, every helping hand given, to heal a child as well as countless other miracles represented in those figures.



The miracles behind the facts and figures are some 5,700 children whose lives have been changed as a result of the work of Morrison Child and Family Services. Many of the children we serve have histories of abuse and neglect, or are at risk, and their parents have often experienced a similar history. Many struggle with drug and alcohol addictions which make it very difficult to make positive change. Yet change can happen and we experience the miracles every day when:

- We see the glint of hope in the eye of a young mother, trying desperately to parent in a way which is foreign to her as she grasps the positive parenting concepts she is learning in our Incredible Years program;
- We meet someone in the community, and she tells us that when she was a child, she was abused, and her therapist at Morrison was the first person to tell her she mattered, and that the treatment she received at Morrison changed her life;
- The young man in one of our drug and alcohol treatment programs, whose addiction at thirteen had already rendered him incapable of functioning in the community safely, who came to us bleary eyed and numbed from drug use, and who now, with clear eyes and a clear mind, is a starter on his high school's basketball team.

These individuals all succeeded because when they reached out for a hand to help them, Morrison was there.

By providing leading mental health practices delivered by committed, caring staff, we are helping children have a greater chance of a good life.

Our ability to serve the vulnerable children of Oregon is only possible with support from our community partners, volunteers, and donors. Government contracts do not cover the total costs of providing services and the need for support continues to grow. Consequently, Morrison relies on you, our community of supporters, to serve our children and families. I sincerely hope you will continue to be part of the Morrison community and consider how you can lend your hand to helping the children of Oregon in the coming year.

About Morrison

Morrison Child and Family Services continues to lead the communities of greater Portland in providing prevention, mental health and juvenile justice services that have a powerful positive impact on the lives of children and their families.

Founded in 1947 by Dr. Carl Morrison, Oregon's first board-certified child psychiatrist, Morrison employs proven, evidence-based practices to support children who have suffered from family abuse, substance abuse, neglect, and other traumas, resulting in mental and emotional issues.

A team of caring professionals work to meet the entire range of a child's needs as they evolve over time, including mental health, early childhood consultation and education, parent education, and case management. Morrison includes the child and family in creating a treatment plan and provides services integrated into the community. To help ensure positive results, Morrison is one of the only nonprofits to self-fund a program evaluation department, which continuously assesses program outcomes and makes recommendations to better serve children and families.

Morrison's **mission** is to provide quality comprehensive social, mental health and educational services that strengthen the family and to establish effective partnerships that promote community responsibility for children and families. This year, we adopted new strategic goals to achieve this mission:

- Help children and families improve their lives by building an organization that plans strategically, implements effectively, and responds quickly to changing conditions.
- Develop innovative programs that meet the community's most critical current and future needs.
- Expand Morrison's resources by increasing our visibility and diversifying our sources of support.

With this focus, Morrison is poised to take the next step in advancing its care of Portland's children.



Programs

Morrison's continuum of care is broad, and while the array is extensive, the results are similarly focused on making a difference in the lives of children.

Early intervention programs for young children include home-based parent training, community and home-based mental health counseling, foster care, school-readiness programs, and corresponding support for parents, foster parents, teachers, and childcare providers. A few of the many highlights this year include:

- Outpatient services provided mental health therapy to nearly 2000 children and families.
- Parent mentor services expanded to support 175 new families.
- The award-winning *Incredible Years* program helped 20 "at risk" groups (3 in Spanish) learn parenting skills, improve their parenting attitudes, and handle challenging child behaviors at home.

Teenagers often seem to fall through the cracks, but at Morrison we are getting them back on track.

- A much higher percentage of youth are back living in their communities, rather than being incarcerated, on the run, or in residential treatment, a year after leaving the Breakthrough program for intensive alcohol and drug treatment (81% up from 32%).
- Arrest rates for teen girls dropped by over half after completing the Rosemont residential program.
- None of the youth who completed the Counterpoint mental health treatment for youth displaying inappropriate sexual behavior have reoffended in the year after leaving treatment, and a very high percent have remained in their communities.

Additional programs include family counseling, crisis intervention, individual treatment and case management services.

Accessible to everyone

Through a grant from **Kaiser Permanente** and **Pacific Power Foundation**, Morrison has been able to greatly improve the service it provides to our Latino population and 300 families were served this year as part of our Outpatient Programs. Focus groups clarified Latino clients' needs and issues with access to services. Programs now include staff training on working with Latino families and a focus on recruiting bilingual-bicultural staff for professional mental health positions. In addition, Morrison has built new relationships with service providers in the Latino community.



Volunteers help make it happen

Anne Kelly Feeney is a volunteer driver for Morrison. For more than five years, she has driven children from school to therapy, often working with the same child for many months and building friendships with them. She considers herself a role model for girls who will one day be parents, and sees great value in providing consistent, safe, caring support. "Many of these children have experienced significant abuse or trauma, and for just a little while each week, I'd like them to feel secure and taken care of," says Anne. She has actively recruited others to join her at Morrison and believes that driving children is not only easy, but incredibly rewarding!

LISTOS PARA APRENDER: READY TO LEARN!

Through our **LISTOS** program, Morrison parent educator, Marcelina, began work with a family in which the parents were very involved in their children's care and worried about their toddler son's lack of spoken language. Soon after Marcelina began home visits, the parents learned that their elementary school-aged daughter had been sexually abused by an extended family member while her brother watched. Marcelina became a focal point for the family. She reported the issue to Child Protective Services, assisted the daughter and the family with getting therapy, and continued to work on the son's developmental issues. Marcelina, through Morrison programs, pulled together all of the pieces needed to help this family mend and care for its children.

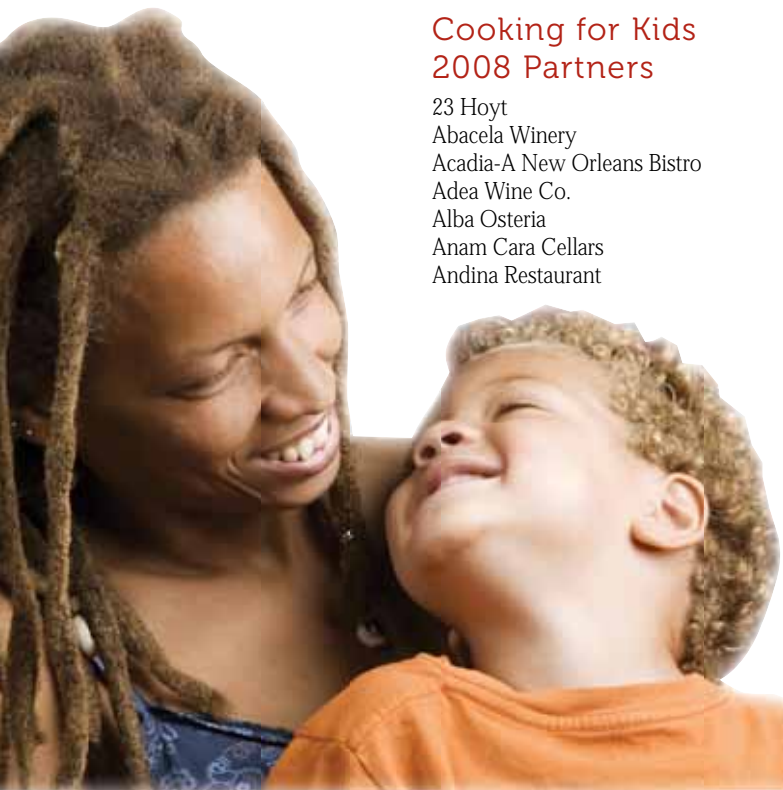
