project in the community addressing a high-profile need, we will build the Rotary Youth Center at Morrison to benefit the families, children and communities of Morrison Child & Family Services for generations to come. The Center will be built on Morrison's property on NE Sandy Boulevard to better serve our clients, staff and community with an expanded space for treatment, training, physical education, recreation, socialization and community group meetings.
