Initial and annual NCI training will continue for staff and resource parents. However, the physical restraint portion of the training will <b>not</b> be included. Morrison TFC/BH-TFC/PCRC programs are currently implementing the Attachment, Regulation, and Competency (ARC) model and the Sanctuary model to decrease the use of restraint. Programs do not use seclusion. Programs has reminded resource families to utilize Morrison On-call support phone line.
